



Boss Lane Story

Boss Lane is a delightful field path that runs north from the sportsfield car park to emerge in the village at Main Street West. 'Bos' is Latin for 'bull, cow or ox'; with an extra 's' added over the years. If the name was originally 'bos', calling it 'Cow Lane' makes a lot of sense. It was an obvious route for villagers to take their cattle to graze on the Outgang and the common land beyond. On a map you can trace a direct route up Boss Lane, Spring Lane (the two used to line up exactly), across the University to The Retreat, and from there to Walmgate Bar. But why Walmgate? Because Walmgate was the site of York's main cattle market in the

16th and 17th centuries, and before (or after) being sold, many of the cattle would have needed access to grazing. The Outgang and the commons beyond would have been perfect. So next time you walk up or down Boss Lane, picture Anglo Saxon, Medieval and Tudor farmers moving their cattle to and from the village and Walmgate, down the lane and out onto the commons beyond. You are indeed walking along a bit of very old England, so those enjoying this ancient lane are asked to help keep it litter free and noise free to preserve the walk into history!

On the wildlife front, deer and hares are seen regularly and that relatively new addition, the buzzard, appears to be omnipresent. It is also good to see little egrets and kingfishers on the Tillmire Drain. Visitors to the Tillmire are advised to keep dogs on leads and



keep to the perimeter to avoid disturbance to rare birdlife.
